Collective work contract with the General Union of Petroleum and Chemical Workers

Representatives of the employees of the Indian-Jordanian Chemical Company Limited held on Wednesday, 15-1-2014 at 3:30 in the company's offices – Amman.

A meeting was held on 15-1-2014 between:

The two parties agreed that:

First: Approval of granting all employees of the company a production bonus for the whole of 2013 of an additional month's salary, which will be effective from 1-3-2014 for those who were on his job on 31-12-2013 and each according to the length of his service.

Second: To study the system of end of service benefits during the year 2014 and apply to those who retire as of 1-2014.

Third: Exceptional increase in the basic salary for all eligible employees and in accordance with the Personnel Regulations as of 1-2014 and 2014 only.

Fourth: To approve the support of the housing fund by 250000 dinars by the company and half a million from the account of the fund for the provision of employees for this year, a total amount of 750,000 dinars.

Fifth: The Second Party shall not be entitled to make any claims of the financial effect for two years from the date of signing this labor agreement.

Sixth: All documents mentioned in a collective agreement registered in the Ministry of Labor shall be documented within two weeks of its date.
